

WORLD GEOGRAPHY COUNTRY PROJECT

You will need one poster board cut in half.

1. On one half of the poster board you will draw the country's flag. This will fill up the whole poster. DO NOT use any computer generated symbols. The poster is the flag.

2. On the flip side of the flag poster board you will explain the color and symbols used on the flag as well as any history associated with it. Make sure you place the country's name on this side as well. This information should be typed, matted, and attached to the poster with double-stick tape or glue. Do not use staples.

3. On the other half of the poster board you will draw a map of the country. On this map you will draw in rivers, lakes, deserts, mountains or mountain ranges, capital and major cities, etc. Place the country's name at the top of this poster. This map should fill up your poster board. Be sure to include a map key. Label the bordering countries or oceans, seas, etc. Type all information and attach it to the map. Use reference sources for a detailed map.

4. On the flip side of the map poster board you will place a list of facts to know about this country. The fact list should be typed, matted, and attached to the poster with double-stick tape or glue. Do not use staples. Have the information in the following order:

1. Official Name
2. Official Languages
3. Capital City
4. Type of Government: Explain
5. Population (2000 census or later)
6. Literacy Rate
7. Voting Age
8. Date of Independence
9. Chief industrial and agricultural products; exports and imports
10. Currency
11. Major Religions
12. Climate Types: Explain
13. Physical Landforms
14. Natural Resources
15. Location of the country in relation to the continent it is on and to surrounding countries.

This is a major project and will count as two test grades. You will also present your project to the class. Your presentation will include your explanation of the flag, the fact list, and an explanation of the map. The presentation will count as a test grade.
