CONDUCT:

- 1. Be prepared for class with all materials and books EVERY day.**

- 14. If you are late to class, you must have a tardy slip to enter the classroom. You are not allowed in the classroom until you have the tardy slip. You are not allowed to return to a teacher to get a note once you are in class.**
- 15. When your teacher or a guest speaker is speaking you are to remain quiet giving them your full attention. If an adult enters the classroom to speak to your teacher, you are to remain quiet and on task.**

ASSIGNMENTS:

1. Come to class prepared.
2. Be diligent in completing all assigned tasks.
3. All assignments must be completed in order to receive credit for this course.
4. Make-up work for excused absences must be turned in 1 day after the absence unless special arrangements have been made with the teacher.
5. YOU are responsible for getting all missed assignments and show them to the teacher.
6. YOU are responsible for any test or project previously announced.
7. All classroom library books and encyclopedias are to stay in my classroom.
8. ALL work must be done in blue or black ink or typed.
9. Homework is due at the beginning of class. It will be accepted late up to twenty-four hours late from the date due for half credit. After twenty-four hours it will not be accepted.
10. ALL EDITORIALS ARE DUE ON THE SPECIFIED DATE; IF YOU ARE ABSENT THEN ON THE FIRST DAY YOU ARE BACK AT SCHOOL. THESE WILL ALSO BE ACCEPTED UP TO TWENTY-FOUR HOURS LATE FOR THIRTY POINTS OFF. THE GRADING WILL BEGIN AT 70.
11. ALL MAJOR OR SEMESTER PROJECTS ARE DUE ON THE SPECIFIED DATE WHETHER OR NOT YOU ARE AT SCHOOL. THEY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED LATE.
